- 3.) They are factory tested with electricity
- 4.) Condom use increased 39% (to 94%) from 1982 to 2006
- 5.) There are over 50 nicknames for condoms

## Ways to Get to Tested:

Blood sample Saliva sample Visual exam Digital (finger) exam

The STI status of an individual is protected healthcare information, it shouldn't be shared with anyone!

## Fluids that transmit STIs:

- 1.) Semen
- 2.) Vaginal Secretions
- 3.) Anal Secretions
  - 4.) Breast Milk 5.) Blood

## How to Put a Condom on:

- Make sure the condom is safe to use (not expired, damaged)
- 2.) Ensure you're trying to roll in the Correct direction

(The drumstick on the front show this)

- 3.) Pinch the tip and place it on the tip
  - 4.) Roll down the shaft
    5.) Have a good time!!

Hint: Putting lube IN the condom can make it a different experience for both!
